SUMMER FUN WITH A PURPOSE

This summer BGCSCC is taking a holistic approach to summer camp by combining High-Yield Learning Activities (HYLA's) with fun and engaging programming to heighten Club kids skills and confidence and avoid summer learning loss.

Together with program staff Clubhouse Unit Directors, Jennifer Sherry and Katee Freeman have created summer curriculum utilizing Boys & Girls Clubs of America's nationally recognized Project Learn program. Project Learn reinforces and enhances the skills and knowledge young people learn during the school year while they are at the Club. This comprehensive program is based on Dr. Reginald Clark's research that shows students do much better in school when they spend their non-school hours engaged in fun, but academically beneficial activities.

By participating in Project Learn, Club staff use their program area to create opportunities for high-yield learning activities (HYLA) including: leisure reading, writing activities, discussions with knowledgeable adults, helping others, homework help and tutoring, and critical thinking games that develop young people's cognitive skills.

One of the ways BGCSCC is incorporating learning with fun is through Drop Every And Read (DEAR) where for 30-45 mins there is a club wide mandate for everyone to drop everything and read. Even our Executive Director Bob Langseth will participate! This time will be used to strengthen Club kids' reading skills over the summer, and to take a much needed Club wide break during the exciting day.

The Downtown Clubhouse Arts Program is embarking on an "environmental" journey around the world, using a "passport project" that the kids complete throughout the summer. The "environment" theme will be supported each week with a sub-theme, such as personal environment, food and cooking, global perspective, water conservation and philanthropy. Technology program highlights including coding, Minecraft Edu and education-based gaming. Our Athletics program will be busy throughout the day, basing all activity and movement on California State K-12 Physical Education Standards.

Live Oak Clubhouse activities include Summer Brain Gain, Jr. Giants, recording studio classes, cooking classes and a learning garden and a teen "Tinker-Table" that will have a daily mind challenge to encourage the teens to use their critical thinking skills to solve problems.

Both Clubhouses will have a robust teen-centered programs with special activities that focus on job and life skills such as resume building, scholarship and college program research, internship exploration, and engaging in college and career preparation such as mock interviews.

The Boys & Girls Clubs of Santa Cruz County believes that no child should ever be turned away because of lack of funds and we are committed to making our camps available to all children. <u>Donate to the Summer Program Scholarship fund here</u>.

Live Oak Clubhouse First Year Anniversary


