



Summer 2018 Newsletter Letter from our Executive Director

Hello BGCSCC family,

I want to take this opportunity to thank everyone who has helped us reach new heights serving the youth of Santa Cruz County. It was very exciting to open our third facility, the **Joe & Linda Aliberti Clubhouse** in Scotts Valley, last month. We have already exceeded 100 new members and over 30 members attending each day. New families are checking in every day to inquire about both our after-school programs and how to participate this summer.

It's almost hard to remember that it was just two short years ago that the **Live Oak Clubhouse** opened and began preparing for their first summer. This Clubhouse now has over 800 members and averages nearly 190 youth every day after school and during the summer.

Boys & Girls Clubs of Santa Cruz County (BGCSCC) has experienced a time of significant growth these past two years and has also met the challenge of increasing program efficacy and meeting quality program metrics, including helping stem the tide of summer learning loss for our members in comparison to other students. Just by the numbers, we have increased total members from 1,200 to over 2,200 and our average daily attendance from 180 to over 370. We are extremely proud to be such an impactful part of the lives of so many youth in our county, but realize there is still much to be done.

BGCSCC has made a commitment to provide all members with a **high-quality Club Experience** that is safe and fun, leads to a sense of belonging, and develops the skills needed to achieve success in the 21st century. We will also strive to continue to learn and develop practices and program models with demonstrated impact, ultimately leading youth to graduate from high school with a plan for the future, develop good character and citizenship, and adopt a healthy lifestyle. It is also important for BGCSCC to **advocate** that every young person in our county has access to high-quality out-of-school-time programs and experiences that equip them with the tools to succeed.

We can't do this alone and hope you are inspired to continue with us on our journey. **Great Futures** may be our slogan, but it should also be within reach of every young person! To see what we are doing at all three Clubhouses this summer please check out the program flyers below.
