We're delighted to share that Cecilia Ruiz-Rocha ("CeCe") has been named as our 2023 Youth of the Year. This prestigious honor is bestowed upon an exemplary young person in recognition of their leadership, service, academic excellence, and dedication to live a healthy lifestyle.

Now in its 76th year, the Youth of the Year program honors our nation's most awe-inspiring young people on their path to great futures. CeCe spoke about her journey at the Boys & Girls Clubs of America's Northern California Youth of the Year competition, as well as the Boys & Girls Clubs of Santa Cruz County's 2nd Annual Grand Tabletop Luncheon at

As Executive Director Lis DuBois explains, "CeCe is a shining example of the young people who make up our Club community. She's kind, respectful, mature beyond her years, and deeply committed to giving back to our community."

CeCe has been a member of the Club for the past eight years, attending each of our organization's three sites, including the Downtown Santa Cruz, Live Oak, and Scotts Valley clubhouses between 2015 and 2019. During that time, the Club provided a safe and supportive environment where she could build friendships, get help with homework, and

explore new activities. This was especially important during busy election seasons in which her mother, a single-parent who works in the Santa Cruz County Clerk's Office, worked long hours supporting local democracy.

"The Club helped shape me into the person I am today, and supports me to make the right choices," CeCe said. She has consistently served as a role model for other Club youth, especially since becoming a part-time staff member at the Joe & Linda Aliberti Clubhouse in 2021. Whether using her passion for books as a way to engage younger members, channeling her love of photography to share pictures of Club activities with families, or serving as a translator for caregivers whose primary language is Spanish,

A senior at Scotts Valley High School, CeCe plans to attend CSUMB or San Jose State University upon graduation. She is interested in studying law and psychology, with the ultimate goal of serving as an advocate for Spanish-speaking children and families involved in the justice system. She explains, "I want to help people in my community, and make a difference in their lives." CeCe is already well on her way to doing just that, having volunteered for several years as a Santa Cruz County elections student worker supporting voter registration and outreach programs, in addition to the mentorship she provides to Club youth daily.

With springtime upon us, I'm thrilled to highlight some of the vibrancy and activity that has filled our three Clubhouses over the past several months.



We've also been building partnerships in the community, with the goal of bringing new opportunities to our Club members. We're grateful to Chase Bank for offering financial literacy programs to our youth and staff, and to the Santa Cruz Community Farmers Market for returning to our Scotts Valley location for the 2023 season. We're partnering with Santa Cruz City Schools to bring summer fun at the Club to youth participating in summer school. And we're thrilled to have been selected as the beneficiary of the 2023 Santa Cruz Sunrise Rotary's annual bike ride, which will raise funds to revitalize our Downtown Club's indoor swimming pool.

The program is open to boys and girls in grades 3-5, and takes place at the Downtown and Live Oak

clubhouses. All skill levels are welcome to join, and the program promotes the power of teamwork to help youth develop themselves and their communities. Soccer & Social is the latest in our series of non-competitive athletic programming where the goals are greater than winning - with an emphasis on growing skills, confidence, teamwork, cooperation, and community.



DIVING INTO AQUATICS AT THE DOWNTOWN CLUBHOUSE!

Spring is the perfect time for kids to build their swimming skills, gain confidence and learn water safety in preparation for summer. And following a long, windy and rainy winter, our heated indoor pool is the perfect place to have fun in the water!

Small-group Swim Lessons cost \$100 for four Saturday sessions, with scholarships available to kids and families who qualify for financial support. These lessons are

available on a rolling monthly basis, and are first-come first-serve.

For Club kids, our non-competitive

development and practice time in the water

Basketball season at the Club was a slam dunk! Over 295 youth players aged 6 to 14 participated in the

6 to 14 participated in the 2022-2023 Boys & Girls Clubs of Santa Cruz County's winter basketball league.

The basketball season brings an incredible energy to our Club, and the Downtown Gym buzzes with fun and the sounds of sport. Once

again, dedicated volunteer coaches focused on skill-building and teamwork to get kids tuned up after a long off-season. Players spread across our four divisions, each with ~10 teams, broken up by age. Each team practiced once per week at the Downtown Clubhouse, with one to two games per weekend. Our 1st and 2nd grade "Biddy Ballers" had a great time while learning the basics.

Jackson (age 12) knew this was his third year playing in the league based on the number of basketball pictures on his refrigerator! "We didn't win a single game all year, but we did win our

refrigerator! "We didn't win a single game all year, but we did win our first game in the playoffs!" Jackson was proud of his development and growth, noting that he made the AAU team this year. This was Alex's (age 10) first time playing in the Club League. Alex said "I liked my team, and miss them! They were good, they passed the ball a lot, and played good defense. They even shot three pointers!"

Both Jackson and Alex are Club regulars, participating in after school and school break camp programs. But the basketball season provided a chance to play on teams with kids whose only experience of the

Boys & Girls Club is the basketball league. Because of the size and reach of our league, basketball season

offers a unique opportunity to welcome families into the Club who represent the full diversity of our community, all in support of our kids on the court. Among the many highlights this season were the end-of-season playoffs at Kaiser Permanente Arena, and a **BGCSCC Club Night at the Santa Cruz**

Warriors game on Saturday March 11th. KP Arena Section A was sold out with BGCSCC Club families and supporters. On that night, both the Club

and the SeaDubs won!

Each Wednesday from September through May, Surf Club gets about 30 local youth out in the water alongside friends and adult mentors, with the goal of building selfconfidence and teaching respect for oneself, others and the environment.

Pleasure Point Surf Club is coming into its 15th year, and 8th year of partnership with the Boys & Girls Club. The Club's all-volunteer coaching staff teaches youth about ocean conservation, wilderness first aid, rescue techniques, and of course, how to surf, boogie board, and bodysurf.
